

PATIENT INFORMATION – INSTRUCTIONS AFTER ANAESTHETIC TO THE EYE

You may find that your eye will be sore for several days. You can take normal painkillers to help reduce the pain. If you are taking other medicines please ask for advice before you leave the Accident and Emergency Department.

Eye Pad

You may have been given a double eye pad to wear which will help you feel more comfortable. You should wear the eye pad until the next dose of any prescribed eye ointment (every 4 - 6 hours).

You should not drive whilst wearing an eye pad or if your vision is affected. Your motor insurance will not be valid in the event of an accident.

Applying your prescribed ointment

- Wash your hands
- Pull your lower eyelid down and starting at the point nearest your nose, squeeze the ointment whilst moving outward towards your ear. It may be easier if someone else does this for you
- Continue applying the ointment as directed by the Accident and Emergency Department.

If your symptoms persist

If symptoms persist for longer than 48 hours, please contact your own GP. You may return to the Accident and Emergency Department if you wish.

Please remember not to rub your eye
