Hospital passports or Traffic Light Assessments

For people with learning disabilities



A **Hospital Passport** is very important for people with a learning disability.

Sometimes it is called a **Traffic Light Assessment**. They are the same thing.



A hospital passport is a book that you can take with you if you need to go hospital.

It has important information about you and the support you may need.



It has information about

- your medication
- your health



- what support you need
- things that are very important to you.



Write in your hospital passport as soon as you get it.

It will be ready if you have to go to hospital.



People who know you well can help you write in it.

If your information changes, change it on your form too.



If you need to go to hospital
take it with you.

Hospital staff need to read your
passport.

It will help them learn how to
give you the right help.



It is **YOUR** passport.

If you go to hospital,
keep it near you all the time.

Show it to staff in different parts
of the hospital, like the ward or
x-ray department.



Hospital passports are very
important.

They can help you get the right
support in hospital.

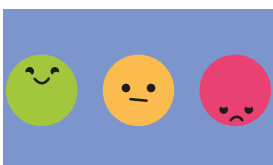
